How does the ABCC affect me?

Construction workers are still covered by unfair laws imposed on them by the **Howard Government**. Over 80 people have been hauled in for **secret interrogations** by the Australian Building and Construction Commission (ABCC) about everyday workplace matters. If they refuse to attend or answer questions, they can be **jailed for six months**. Now CFMEU Official **Noel Washington faces jail** because he refused to answer questions relating to a union meeting held off site in a lunch break. The penalties for breaking these laws are unprecedented in Australian workplace law, and do not apply even in criminal cases. **These laws only apply to construction workers.**

What can I do?

You can help to give construction workers the same rights as other workers by making sure that you are informed. You can also help by sharing that information to gain the support of your workmates, your boss, your family and friends.



Come to the rally on 26 November 2008 and demand that you are treated the same as all other Australian workers.
